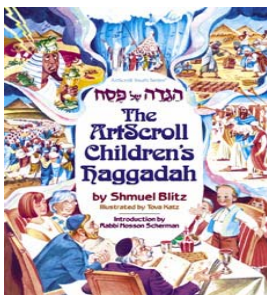


## HAGGADOT A SELECTED BIBLIOGRAPHY

*The Artscroll Children's Haggadah* by Shmuel Blitz, illustrated by Tova Katz. Brooklyn, NY: Mesorah Publications, 2000. The traditional Haggadah in Hebrew with simplified English translation, profusely illustrated in color, with questions and Midrashic tidbits of interest to children.

*ArtScroll Youth Haggadah* by Nosson and Yitzchok Zev Scherman; illustrated by Yosef Dershowitz and Dovid Sears. New York, NY: Mesorah Publications, 1987.

A fully illustrated traditional Haggadah with complete Hebrew text, simplified translation, and commentary, from an Orthodox perspective.

*Building Jewish Life: Haggadah* by Joel Grishaver. Los Angeles, CA: Torah Aura, 1989.

A family Haggadah with instructions for performing the Seder rituals, English transliterations of Hebrew phrases, and illustrations are included.



*A Children's Haggadah* by Howard I. Bogot and Robert J. Orkand, illustrated and designed by Devis Grebus. New York, NY: Central Conference of American Rabbis, 994. A beautifully illustrated Haggadah with simplified English text, some Hebrew, songs and musical notation, and fold-out pages. Key blessings and phrases are in Hebrew, English and transliteration.

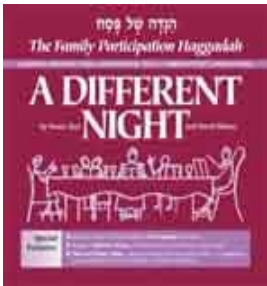


***The Commentators' Pesach Seder Haggadah: Insights from the Sages on the Pesach Haggadah*** by Yitzchak Sender.

The fourth in a series of Haggadah commentaries, including new insights, stories, and parables from traditional rabbinic sources, plus the best from the three previous books.

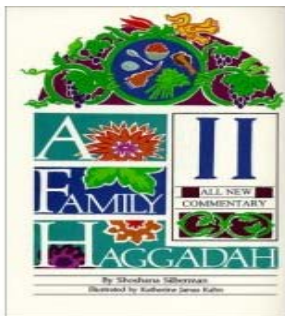
***A Different Night: The Family Participation Haggadah*** by Noam Zion and David Dishon. Jerusalem, ISRAEL: Shalom Hartman Institute, 1997.



The complete Passover text with educational innovations to involve everyone at the Seder - adult and child alike! This text contains ideas for discussion for many Passovers to come! It includes an in-depth leader's guide with supplementary articles and essays on the Seder, as well as a proposal for a multi-year curriculum, using the Haggadah.

***A Family Haggadah*** by Shoshana Silberman. Rockville, MD: Kar-Ben Copies, Inc., 1987.

An innovative Seder service with young children's participation in mind. The main Hebrew texts are provided.

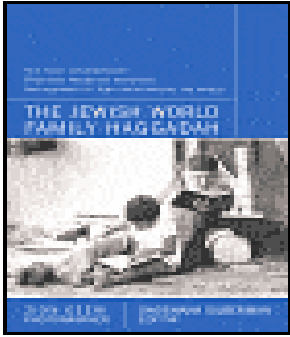
This Haggadah contains all new commentary and is designed for older children.

***The Family Haggadah*** by Ellen Schechter, illustrations by Neil Waldman. New York, NY: Penguin Books, 1999.

This book interweaves original writing with traditional Haggadah, prayer book, and Biblical texts, as well as with Midrash (rabbinic stories and commentaries).

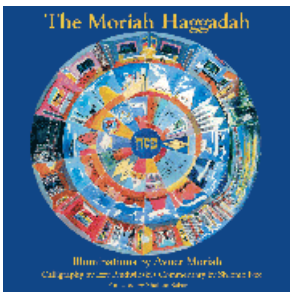
***Gates of Freedom Haggadah*** by Chaim Stern, illustrations by Andrea Meyer. West Orange, NJ: Behrman House, Inc., 1999.

An adaptation of the Haggadah, with some additions and some rearrangements of the Seder. Contains black and white illustrations and some music.



***The Jewish World Family Haggadah*** edited by Shoshana Silberman. New York, NY: Ibooks, Inc., 2005.

A contemporary Haggadah featuring Zion Ozeri's photographs of Jews from around the world. The text is supplemented with commentaries, discussion questions, activities, and songs to make the Seder interactive and engaging for participants of all ages.



***The Moriah Haggadah - Illuminations*** by Avner Moriah. Hebrew calligraphy by Izzy Pludwinski, Commentary by Shlomo Fox. Philadelphia, PA: Jewish Publication Society, 2005.

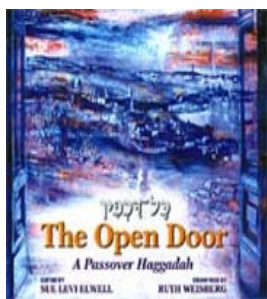
Featuring the magnificent color illuminations of Avner Moriah, this is a beautiful "coffee table" Haggadah.

***My Very Own Haggadah*** by Judyth Robbins Saypol and Madeline Wikler, illustrated by Chaya Burstein. Rockville, MD: Kar-Ben Copies, Inc., 1983.

A Seder service designed for the interests, capacity for learning and attention spans of young children.

***A Night of Questions: A Passover Haggadah***, edited by Joy Levitt and Michael Strassfeld. Elkins Park, PA: Reconstructionist Press, 2000.

An innovative Haggadah that has included "voices of the four children," Miriam's Cup, blessings presented in two different formulas, (one traditional and one universal), alternative ways to tell the story (including a play and bibliodrama), and modern commentaries.



***The Open Door: A Passover Haggadah***, edited by Sue Levi Elwell, drawings by Ruth Weisberg. New York, NY: Central Conference of American Rabbis, 2002.

A Reform Haggadah, that includes innovative and creative expression, yet follows the traditional Seder format. Includes poems and stories. Available for download at

***The Passover Haggadah: The Feast of Freedom***. New York, NY: The Rabbinical Assembly, 1982.

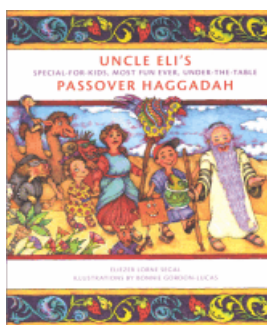


The complete text including commentary, questions and readings about the Holocaust and birth of the State of Israel.

***Studies on the Haggadah from the Teachings of Nechama Leibowitz***, edited by Yitzhak Reiner and Shmuel Peerless. New York/Jerusalem: Urim Publications, 2002.

This Haggadah includes Seder-related quotations from Nechama Leibowitz's teachings. The questions relate to the Haggadah and to the Biblical verses on which it is based, with suggested answers. The purpose of the book is to enable families to engage in meaningful discussion of the story of Exodus during the Seder. Excerpts are available at

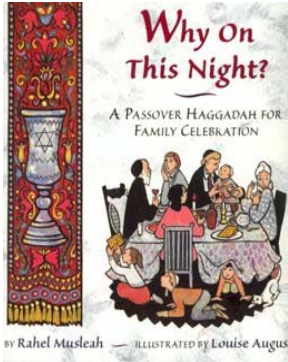


***Uncle Eli's Special-for-Kids, Most Fun Ever, Under-the-Table***

***Passover Haggadah*** by Eliezer Lorne Segal, illustrated by Bonnie Gordon-Lucas. San Francisco, CA: No Starch Press, 2003.

Selections of the Seder, retold, Dr Seuss-style, to delight children of all ages. The illustrations are whimsical and fun! Includes a glossary.

***We Tell It to Our Children: The Story of Passover - A Haggadah for Seders with Young Children*** by Mary Ann Barrows Wark. St. Paul, MN: Mt. Zion Congregation Rabbi's Publication Funds and Mensch Makers Press, 1988. Black and white illustrations accompany the English text. Cut-out figures are provided for puppet making.



***Why on This Night? A Passover Haggadah for Family Celebration*** by Rahel Musleah, illustrated by Louise August. New York, NY: Simon & Shuster Book for Young Children, 2000. This Haggadah gives children a central part in leading, participating, and questioning the Seder through song, dance, drama, and action.

***The Women's Seder Sourcebook: Rituals and Readings for Use at the Passover Seder***, edited by Sharon Cohen Anisfeld, Tara Mohr and Catherine Spector. Woodstock, VT: Jewish Lights Publishing, 2003.

A collection of rituals and readings for use at the Passover Seder, all written by women from a feminist perspective. Contains a guide to planning a women-only Seder, a glossary of Hebrew terms, and an index.

***The Why Haggadah*** by Chanan Simon and Yosef Friedman. Jerusalem, ISRAEL: Beit Shamai Publications, 1989.

More than 100 Passover questions and answers are included in this Haggadah. The traditional text and its translations are provided.
